OPEN BURNING OFFICIALLY BANNED IN BOROUGH

On September 5, 2006, the Borough Council officially ended the practice of open burning for the purpose of eliminating rubbish.

Through the end of October, residents may contact the Borough office at 473-3414 to have your EMPTIED burn barrels hauled away, free of charge. Thereafter, it will be the resident's responsibility to remove the barrels from their property. All residents have until November 30, 2006 to remove the barrels or face fines. Residents found in violation of the burning ban will face fines ranging from \$25 to \$100 for a first offense, and \$50 to \$300—or jail time for a second or subsequent offense. Liberty Glass Center thanks all of you who care enough to recycle your materials with us. Volunteers are needed so if you care to get involved we will be glad to show you how we prepare the materials for market. Sorting the shiny ads out of the newspapers is a great help. Recycle your shiny ads with your magazines in a bag separate from your newspapers. Recycling only bottles and food jars (no candle

jars, drinking glasses, coffee cups, or window glass) saves us from picking those materials out of a pile of broken glass. Cereal boxes, soda can frig packs and shoe boxes are usually not made of corrugated cardboard, please do not include them with your cardboard boxes. We must pay to dispose of all the non-recyclable materials you dump on us. Remember, we now recycle #1 and #2 plastic bottles also. *Please do*

From the Fire Chief: Brian Crebs

As I am writing this today, paredness. Now it wasn't folks all over the Central Susquehanna Valley are breathing a sigh of relief. The rain has finally stopped after a three-day constant downpour. The sun is out and shining briefly today, but there is still a breeze of anticipation blowing off of the river. Everyone is concerned about the rising waters of the Susquehanna to prepare their houseand what impact they will play on our everyday routines.

It has been a tough 60 hours or so for the Fire Departments of Northumberland and Point Township. We have worked together very closely over the past 3 days to handle approximately 60 incidents, big and small. One VERY good thing has come from our most recent severe weather event. The Mayor, Police Chief, **Emergency Management** Coordinator, Public Safety Committee Chair, and I have had a meeting to examine ways that we can better serve you during our next incident. I foresee these meetings continuing on a quarterly basis.

Folks, I would like to cover a couple of important issues with you. The first is about the responsibility of emergency pre-

long ago that the Federal government put out some information about gathering food, water, batteries and enough duct tape to surround your home. While I'm not too enthusiastic about the duct tape idea, the others are not bad suggestions. Residents of the borough should take a few minutes holds for emergencies. Having some bottled water, extra non-perishable food items, flashlight (no candles please), batteries, portable radio, and some first aid supplies handy can make all the difference when the power is out or when even the weathermen aren't even sure what's in store. Also, develop a contact person who preferably lives out of state. Advise all members of your household to check in with this person following a serious event, that way if local infrastructure should be affected your family will be able to account for themselves.

Next is preparing your home itself. Many residents who do not normally get water in their homes have over the last few days. My home was affected as well. We visit some folks to pump their basement every time there is a serious rain event. If you know you get water please, please take steps to help yourselves out in these situations. There are fixes for rainwater runoff that enters basements, some of them are inexpensive.

Budget to purchase a sump pump and check it occasionally to ensure it is working. If you're unsure of how your equipment will perform due to its age or condition, purchase a back-up pump and have it on hand incase your existing pump fails. It's often easier (and cheaper) to find one on a sunny summer day, rather than when the dark clouds are surrounding Lowes or Home Depot. Perhaps an auxiliary submersible pump would be handy to store on a shelf for a "rainy" day.

Other relatively easy fixes would be to ensure that rainspouts are connected and directed away from your home as much as possible. Of course they only function correctly when they are free of blockage. Sometimes regrading of the lawn surrounding your house can have a great affect on wet basements. This only re-

Northumberland Borough will have Christmas tree pick-up from Jan. 2nd thru Jan. 17th, 2007.


The final dates for pick-up will be January 15, 16, and 17th following the street-sweeping

quires some good dirt, a wheelbarrow, rakes, some quality grass seed, and some friends to help!


Finally, ask your heating equipment provider if your home heating equipment can be raised off the floor, even if only by a few inches. This includes boilers and furnaces, water heaters, and home heating oil tanks. For houses in the flood plain strapping heating oil tanks and water heaters down is also desirable.

Just like it is a homeowner's responsibility to ensure the sidewalks are in great shape in front of their homes, they need to take responsi-

bility for emergency preparedness. It's a simple matter of helping us help you. We would NEVER deny anyone services, but I can tell you that during our most recent rainfall we had to prioritize our responses and we simply couldn't get to everyone. As you may have read from one of my last articles, we are struggling for manpower and we have to use the same folks to pump basements that would also be responding to other various emergencies of a more severe nature. So please, please, put some of these items into your budget plan as well as your own "honey-do" list, and look for other changes in how we will handle these emergencies in

the future.

My next item is VERY, VERY serious. Every day I read reports of firefighters being struck and killed while working to help citizens at traffic incidents. Every day, firefighters are injured or worse while providing services in the street. You might think that these only occur in areas populated by freeways and superhighways, and if you think that you're wrong! We have had two incidents in the borough this year and I know of another in Snyder County. I am bothered by this fact tremendously and I (Continued on page 14)

am simply NOT willing to explain to a firefighter's wife or mother that their loved-one was injured or killed at the scene of a traffic incident in our borough or anywhere we respond.

We have taken every precaution to try to protect the victims of the incidents we respond to, as well as ourselves. We use our Fire Police on our incidents to control traffic and guide motorists thru congestion. We have all of our personnel wearing highvisibility traffic vests even over our regular protective clothing. We also park our apparatus in a manner to provide physical protection to our responders.

This is not enough! It comes down to motorists knowing that the flashing lights on our apparatus are not there to look pretty during parades. They are there to tell drivers that there is an emergency or other situation that they need to pay special attention to. Motorists also need to know that if they choose not to heed this warning, and give us the space and time that we need, there will be penalties. It should

be common courtesy; after all it could very well be YOU we are working so hard to benefit someday.

One last thing before I go! The Northumberland Fire Department is looking for a web designer. This is not a paying position; however the experience will be priceless. I will personally guarantee it! It's a chance for a computer savvy individual to work with literally one of the oldest Fire Departments in this country and to tell its story. We're looking for this website to be a history lesson, public safety education tool, and recreational web area for firefighters to view. We have a bounty of materials and photographs ready to go, all we need is the right person. If interested call Jan at the borough office and she will put you in touch with me. Thanks so much!
