HISTORY DAY PLANNED FOR MAY 9TH

Mark your calendar for Saturday, May 9 for the 7th Annual History Day! The celebration will take place in King Street Park in Northumberland, 10am – 4pm. This family fun event will take you back in time to experience the days of canals, tea parties, open hearth cooking, folk music, and more.

Northumberland is full of remarkable history. Not only is Northumberland home to Joseph Priestley; it also boasts a wealth of railroad and canal history. Did you know that Northumberland was one of the most preeminent canal towns in Pennsylvania, with three canals coming together at the basin? Canals became extremely valuable in the early days of transportation, cutting the cost of freight by nearly two thirds! The canal history of Northumberland will surely not be forgotten at this event. Stop by to see Captain Mick and watch his canal history slide show at 11am and 2pm in the Christ United Method Church. The Muncy Historical Society's packet boat will also be on display. The PA Canal Society will be on hand to answer any questions you have on the canals.

There will be a variety of live demonstrations including the Victorian high wheelers, chair caning, needlepoint, muzzle loading, a blacksmith, and soap making. In addition to the live demonstrations, there will be plenty of displays to peruse as well. There will be railroad

artifacts, local farm history, outhouse artifacts, pre-war bicycles, WWI and WWII artifacts, and the Furmano's Food Display. Quilts will also be on display; including the 1976 Northumberland bicentennial quilt. John Moore will be exhibiting with his books and 1750's storytelling. The Fort Augusta Regiment and 1750's re-enactors will also be a sight not to miss! Be sure to check out the Strolling 19th Century Flea Circus & Snake Oil Medicine Show!

STIMULUS FUNDING

The Borough staff attended a recent webinar for municipal officials regarding the use of stimulus funds and the application process. Borough staff will be using this information to pursue all available

programs. Earlier this year, the borough replied to a request from the Northumberland County Planning Commission for a list of shovel-ready projects. The county list was compiled at the request of Senator Chris Carney. Most recently, the Northumberland Police department applied to the COPS program for an additional officer.

The official federal site is www.recovery.gov and the official PA site is www.recovery.pa.gov. Numerous websites provide information regarding stimulus funds. We urge everyone to be cautious when searching for stimulus funding information.

Hundreds of stimulus scams have sprung up, please keep in mind that direct payments to individuals are extremely limited and no action is necessary on your part. *Any direct payments to individuals will come through official government channels.* If you think you may be eligible for a direct payment, please consult the official PA website for more information. NO application fees are required to apply for funding requests.

JOINT COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE

The Planning Commissions of Northumberland and Point Township hosted a public meeting to review the Northumberland/Point Township Joint Comprehensive Plan. At the conclusion of the meeting, the Commissions voted to approve the plan. The next step is a 45day public review period during which residents and other governmental bodies are able to submit comments and questions to the Borough Council and Board of Supervisors. At the conclusion of the review period, the Borough Council and Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing. The date of the public hearing will be advertised in the Daily Item and posted on the Borough website www.northumberlandborough.com.

Copies of the plan are available for review at the Borough Office, the Point Township Building and the Priestley-Forsyth Memorial Library and online at www.northumberlandborough.com.

Residents are encouraged to review the plan and voice their comments. Written comments are due at the Borough or Point Township offices by May 22nd. All comments will be reviewed by the Borough and Township officials prior to the plan's adoption so any comments with significance may be included in the plan.

With the finalization of the comprehensive plan, the participating communities will have a blueprint for future

JOSEPH PRIESTLEY HOUSE

In early March, the PA Historic & Museum Commission released a plan for its future. The plan recommended discontinuing operations at the Priestley House. While the report did not recommend a date, it could possibly be as early as July 1st. The deadline means Priestley House supporters have very little time to develop an alternative plan. More than 100 supporters of the museum attended a public meeting on April 9th.

Borough officials have sent letters of support to Senator Gordner, State Representative Merle Phillips, Museum Director Barbara Franco, and Governor Edward Rendell.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH PROGRAM

Neighborhood Watch Programs have proven to be one of the most effective means available for keeping crime out of neighborhoods. This program enlists the active participation of residents in cooperation with local police departments to reduce the incidences and fears of the crime in our community.

Recent acts of vandalism within the Borough of Northumberland have motivated residents to form The Northumberland Borough Neighborhood Watch program.


YUCK! EWWWW! PHEW!
