The regularly scheduled meeting of the Northumberland, Borough Council, was held this evening; with the following members present: Aceto, Brown, Hackenberg, Hollenbach, Lewis, Skelly Sanders, Waltz, Absent President Zimmerman.

Meeting called to order by the Mayor, acting in behalf of the Vice President, opened by a prayer of all members. At this time the Vice President arrived, and took over the meeting; a motion to not read the minutes, of the last meeting of the council was made by Brown seconded by Sanders; in order to save time; so ordered.

E.F. Pfeiffer was present and explained his plan to change the holder of the Liability Policy from the Maryland Casualty Co to the Hartford Traveler's Co.: in so doing, the same coverage and all benefits, could be had, as a saving of \$200.00 premium increase, which quite possibly will be added by the Maryland Casualty Co. It was moved by Brown and seconded by Aceto: to accept this recommendation, upon a vote it was so ordered.

Communications were read from the following sources; Garber Equipment Corp. Commonwealth of Penna: Dept of Health, Recreation Committee, Planning Commission, Penna Department of Highways. Robert Brown presented Council, with a copy of the minutes of the Recreation Commission, held February 1966. the following reports were read and upon a motion of Aceto seconded by Brown ordered accepted and filed, Board of Health reported complaints received and abated 4, X-Ray cards issued 158, Fees collected \$2.00, Number 1 Fire Company and Moose Club The Police Department reported the following 84 Calls answered, meter repaired 11, Accidents investigated 7, Auto theft 1, Fatal Accident 1 Meter fines \$65.00, Motor Code \$80.00, total \$145.00, The Treasurer reported for the Sewer Account Deposited 2181.63, The Treasurer reported for the Borough General Account North Water Co permits 33.00, Donald Treon 1198.67, R.S. Whitmer Fines \$140.00, B.E. Weirick 74.00, Harold Hessler 319.80, M.H. Weidner 97.50, W.W. Hoffman 34.00, E. Calhoun 1.00, Henry Clark 10.00, Jack H. Pyers 10.00, Cash 2.00, J.D. Kiger 5.00, Acorn League 32.31, John Thatcher 1.00, Sewer Revenue Account 372.63 Total \$ 2285.91.

A request from the recreation commission, for the Borough to furnish supervision to proposed young boys working, was tabled.

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Fred Troxell was present and presented proposed plans for the improvement of Jefferson street, in his new addition, in the Northern part of the Borough; stated that his plan called for a 50 ft right of way, at present a 27ft highway, with five foot left for future requirements it was after considerable discussion, upon a motion of Sanders seconded by Lewis, agreed, that after a survey of the street, having been made, by the Borough surveyor, that if it was acceptable, the Borough would then accept the street, also required was a 6 " C.A.B.C base.

The various committees then reported Fire committee stated that plans are being studied, by the four local companies, to improve the Warning system. Health committee stated that, it thought that all interested parties, for the Borough Health Officer position, be given an opportunity to take an examination, for the position. The Mayor stated that he had been informed that certain categories, of jobs; did not require this stated that T.C. Walker, was a registered Health Officer, and as such he could be exempted, but that he was agreeable to take the examination if it was required. Dr Aceto stated that upon appointment of a Health Officer, He would then resign. The Finance committee reported a balance of \$4514.25. The Mayor stated that if council desired, a Cannon would be donated to the Borough, for placement in the Park, as part of the memorial area, it was tentatively accepted, pending a decision by the Northumberland-Point Township Chamber of Commerce. It was upon a motion of Hollenbach, seconded by Skelly agreed to increase the cost, to all street opening permits, from the present rate of \$1.00 per sq.ft, to \$ 2.50 per sq foot. effective at once.

Bids for the purchase of a new Police Car were then opened, the contract was awarded to the J.Wesley Ruch, Agency, for a 1966 Ambassador 250 H.P. vehicle, for the price of \$705.40 plus the trade in of a 1965 Rambler. Bid was received from the Sunbury Motor Company for a Ford, but the price difference was too great, there for upon a motion of Aceto, seconded by Brown the bid was ordered given to J.Wesley Ruch, upon a vote it was so ordered.

The bid for the Borough wide 1966 Street improvement program was then opened, only one bid was received, that from the Middle Creek Paving Co. as follows; Elliot Drive Beginning at Fifth street, a distance of 1580 ft back to Fifth street. East Fifth street Beginning at Elliot Drive 290 X 32 West Third street Duke Street West 200 x 32 feet and the Borough wide resurfacing program total bid price 37,567.00, less a large portion of the Elliot Drive cost, to Brosious Lumber Co. A motion of Hollenbach seconded by Sanders to accept pending approval of the Brosious Lumber Co. for their part



Upon a vote, the motion was accepted, pending the approval of Broschious Lumber Co.

Waltz brought up the question, of an improvement in the drainage along the Interchange Tracks, between Sheetz avenue; and Orange street, it was agreed, to have the Borough Foreman, to make recommendations as to relative cost and other information, at the next meeting of council.

The trash cans, which were ordered by the Northumberland Civic Club, have arrived, and it was agreed to place cans in the Park and at convenient location in the business area, of the town.

#### ORDINANCE # 234

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING, DIRECTING THE PAVING AND PLACING OF CURBS OF FIFTH STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF NORTHUMBERLAND FROM A POINT 285 FEET NORTHEAST OF STRAWBRIDGE ROAD FOR A DISTANCE OF 290 FEET TO A POINT 575 FEET NORTHEAST OF STRAWBRIDGE ROAD: AND DIRECTING THE PAVING AND PLACING OF CURBS ON ELLIOT DRIVE IN THE SUNNYHILL SUB SECTION OF THE BOROUGH OF NORTHUMBERLAND AND DIRECTING THE PAVING AND PLACING OF CURBS ON THIRD STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF NORTHUMBERLAND FROM THE SOUTHWESTERLY LINE OF DUKE STREET TO A POINT 110 FEET SOUTHWEST OF THE SOUTHWESTERLY LINE OF DUKE STREET: AND ALSO ASSESSING THE ABUTTING PROPERTY OWNERS OF SAID STREETS.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDIANED by the Borough of Northumberland in Town Council assembled, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same:

Section 1 Fifth Street in the Borough of Northumberland, from a point 285 feet northeast of Strawbridge Road for a distance of 290 feet to a point 575 feet northeast of Strawbridge road is hereby directed to be ~~pav~~ paved with a permanent type of pavement together with concrete curbing, necessary grading and draining. The work shall be done by contract and awarded to the lowest and best bidder.

Section 11. Elliot Drive in the Sunnyhill Subdivision of the Borough of Northumberland, as shown on the plot or plan of said subdivision, is hereby directed to be paved with a permanent type pavement together with concrete curbing, necessary grading and draining. The work shall be done by the lowest and best bidder.

Section 111. Third street in the Borough of Northumberland on the southwesterly side of Duke street, to a point 110 feet southwest ~~to~~ of the southwesterly line of Duke Street, is hereby directed to be paved with a permanent type of paving together with concrete curbing along the

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northwesterly side of said street, with the necessary grading and draining. The work shall be done by contract and awarded to the lowest and best bidder.

Section IV. The costs and expenses of the entire work shall be paid by the Borough of Northumberland and the owners of real estate bounded or abutting on said streets in accordance with the Act of Assembly approved May 4, 1927, P.L. 519, Section 1712, as amended by the Act of July 10, 1947, P.L. 1621, Section 51, as amended by Act of December 1, 1959 P.L. 16 Section 23, as amended by the act of February 1, 1966. No 581, Section 1761. at least 1-3 of the paving to be paid by the Borough and the same is hereby appropriated herefore out of the funds now or hereafter in the treasury and the balance not more than 2-3 of the paving to be paid by the owners of real estate bounding or abutting on said streets, and the entire costs of the curbs shall be paid by the property owners bounding or abutting on said streets, and the same is hereby assessed and the assessments appropriated therfore.

Section V.. All ordinances or resolutions or parts thereof inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

A Special Meeting of the Northumberland Borough Council, was held this evening; in the Borough Office, for the purpose of changing the paving program, for this year, to eliminate the proposed, improvement from Duke Street West to a point 110 ft

Also to discuss the Resolution from the Northumberland Sewer Authority, said Resolution, taking action by the Sewer Authority to dissolve the authority.

Present President Zimmerman, Brown, Hackenberg, Lewis, Skelly, and Waltz Absent, Aceto and Hollenbach.

It was after a discussion, upon a motion of Brown seconded by Sanders, that the Third Street part of the contract, be withdrawn and not to pave said Third Street, this year, upon a vote it was so ordered.

The Sewer Authority Resolution was then read by the Secretary, as follows;

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Northumberland Sewer Authority is an Authority which was organized February 4, 1952, under the Municipality Authorities Act of 1945, approved May 2, 1945, P.L. 382, pursuant to an Ordinance of the Borough Council of the Borough of Northumberland, Northumberland County, Pennsylvania, for the purpose of constructing a sewage treatment plant for operation by the said Borough;

AND WHEREAS, the said Borough conveyed the land on which the sewage treatment plant was to be erected and the then existing sewage collection system of the Borough to the Authority, and the Authority caused to be constructed the sewage treatment plant, which facilitates the Authority leased back to the Borough by Lease dated as of February 1, 1953;

AND WHEREAS, the said construction was financed by issuing \$250,000.00 principal amount of Sewer Revenue Bonds dated as of February 1, 1953, secured by an indenture between the Authority and the Northumberland National Bank, Northumberland Pennsylvania, as Trustee, dated as of February 1, 1953;

AND WHEREAS, on February 1, 1966, the last remaining outstanding bonds of said bond issue were paid off, so that on that date all of said bonds were paid and discharged, together with interest due thereon, and no claims are now outstanding against said Authority;

AND WHEREAS, by reason of the payment of all the Bonds issued by the Authority, the said Borough may now, at any time terminate said Lease of February 1, 1953, and cause the property of the Authority to be turned back to the Borough;

AND WHEREAS, the reasons for creation of said Authority and its continued existence are no longer present, and it is therefore, deemed advisable by the Authority that its property be conveyed, transferred and turned back to the Borough of Northumberland to the end that the said Borough may obtain ownership in its own right of the said sewer system, sewage treatment plant, land upon which the same is erected, together with all unexpended funds of the Authority now in its hand and in the hands of said Trustee, and that the Authority be dissolved in accordance with



provisions of Section 1e of the Municipality Authorities Act of May 2, 1945, P.L. 328, as amended, 53 P.S. 317.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Northumberland Sewer Authority does hereby request the Borough Council of the Borough of Northumberland to consent to and accept the conveyance and transfer of all the property of the Authority to the Borough of Northumberland.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that after the property of the Authority has been duly conveyed and transferred to the Borough of Northumberland the Authority submit to the Borough Council of the Borough of Northumberland a Certificate requesting the termination of the existence of said Authority to be approved by said Borough Council which Certificate endorsed with such approval shall be filed with the Secretary of the Commonwealth.

BE IT RESOLVED FURTHER, that a certified copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the Borough Council of the Borough of Northumberland.

After the reading of the above Resolution, and after questions to the Solicitor, being answered, it was upon a motion of Brown seconded by Sanders, upon a vote ordered accepted.

It was upon a motion of Brown seconded by Lewis, that a letter of appreciation, or a certificate to each member of the Authority be presented at a proposed supper, to be held next month, a tentative date being June 8th, 1966, upon a vote it was so ordered.

The following resolution was then read by the Solicitor as follows;

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Northumberland Sewer Authority, by Resolution adopted at a duly convened meeting held on May 9, 1966, requested that Borough Council of the Borough of Northumberland consent to and accept the conveyance and transfer of all of the property of the Authority to the Borough of Northumberland.

AND WHEREAS, the Northumberland Sewer Authority, after the transfer of the property to the Borough will request the Borough Council to approve the termination of the existence of said Authority, which certificate endorsed with such approval shall be filed with the Secretary of the Commonwealth.

NOW THEREFORE, Resolve, that Council of the Borough of Northumberland does hereby authorize the acceptance from the Northumberland Sewer Authority of the conveyance and transfer of all property of the Authority to the Borough of Northumberland.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that after the property of the Authority has been duly conveyed and transferred to the Borough of Northumberland, and when the Authority submits to the Borough Council a certificate requesting the termination of the existence of said Authority, the Borough Council doth authorize the endorsement of said certificate by its officer; which certificate and approval shall be filed with the Secretary of the Commonwealth.

The above resolution was discussed, and then upon a motion of Sanders seconded by Hackenberg, upon a n Aye Vote so ordered.

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The Secretary was instructed to contact the Michael Baker Engineering Company, of Rochester Pennsylvania; and request them to send a representative to Northumberland, for the purpose, of conducting a survey, for the proposed extension of the present sewer line, from a point at or near Fifth and Strawbridge Road to a point beyond the street known as Jefferson to have the survey include Villa-Vista, also the possibility of the Susquehanna road being connected with the proposed new extension, either by gravity or by the use of a pumping station.

Moved by Brown and seconded by Lewis meeting be adjourned. so ordered.

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Northumberland Borough was held this evening; with the following members present. President Zimmerman Aceto, Brown, Hackenberg, Hollonbach, Lewis, Sanders, Skelley and Weltz.

Opened by a prayer for guidance, by Hackenberg.

Communications were received from the following sources, Northumberland Planning Commission, Penna State Association of Borough, Shikellamy School District, School Income Tax Collector, Michael Baker Jr Inc.; Erie Lackawanna R.R.Co. Also from the Department of Health for the State.

The minutes of the last regular and Special Meeting were not read, upon a motion of Brown seconded by Hollenbach, in order to save time.

The reports from various sources; were then read, and upon a motion of, Brown seconded by Sanders ordered accepted and filed, as follows; Police reported the following 56 calls, 12 accidents investigated, 2 Auto Thefts 1 hit & Run, 4 Traffic Hazards, Meter Fines \$70.00, motor Code 20.00, total fines \$90.00, The Board of Health reported the following; complaints received and abated, 11, X-Ray Cards issued, 17, Fees collected \$1.00, The Treasurer reported for the Sewer Revenue Account as follows; deposited 752.34, Tap George Moyer 50.00 total \$802.43. The Treasurer reported for the Borough General Account the following; M.H. Weidner Dump 90.00, G.H. Moyer street openings 7.50, Samule Wolfe 5.70, Jack Hessler 371.00, B.E. Weirick Meter Fines 65.00 R.S. Whitmer Motor fines 80.00, E. Calhoun permits 2.00, J.F. Snyder Taxes 1764.64, Clarence Toden permit 5.00, Donald Treon 11076.04 North'd Water Co 5.00, Fred Troxell permit 5.00, Penna Gas & Oil 7.50 W.B. SIMINGTON 5.00, H.E. Wyne 5.00, County Commissioners 114.20, Andrews Hdwe 12.00, Russell Fairchild 5.00, Sewer Revenue Acct 399.83. Total 14,125.41 A letter was received from Fred Troxell relative to a motion made by Charles Lewis seconded by Donald Sanders and carried at the last meeting of the council " Fred Troxell presented plans for opening up of Jefferson Street in the "Hill Top View "Development. He asked the Borough to accept 900 feet of proposed Jefferson Street beginning at Strawbridge Road and extending toward Fifth Street. Said Street will be 50 ft wide with middle 27 ft to have stone base six (6) inches deep topped with oil and chips to hold base for a few years. Motion to accept the proposal was made by Charles Lewis and seconded by Donald Sanders motion carried. This was incorporated into these minutes, upon the advice of the Solicitor.

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Dr Aceto, resigned the office of Borough Health Officer, effective June 1st, 1966, Elizabeth Calhoun deputy to terminate her position on June 30th, 1966. Thomas C. Walker being appointed Health Officer, for the Borough effective 6-1-66, at the salary of \$100.00 per month, beginning on the 1st of July 1966; Miss Calhoun to be paid for this months salary at the termination of her tour of duty. The Borough secretary was instructed to notify Dr. J. J. Wunsch, as to the change in the Borough Health Official, upon a motion of Aceto seconded by Brown so ordered.

Reports of the various committees was then had, a motion of Aceto, seconded by Hollenbach, recommending that the Recreation Commission, have a representative present at the next council meeting to explain various phases of the proposed program to council was upon a vote so ordered. Lewis gave a talk upon some of the proposed activities of the planning commission a general discussion was then had, nothing definite, took place. Michaels stated that he thought that about Twenty Two tones of Amesite, would be all that would be required, to eliminate at water condition at Wheatley avenue and Third street, where surface water is getting into the Lutheran Church property basement. William Sabo, asked council, to inquire into the possibility of getting a book from the Federal Government, relative to methods, necessary to follow in requesting Federal Aid. A discussion then ensued, relative to closing over the run at the Catholic Church property, about 120 feet more or less, a motion by Hollenbach seconded by Sanders, that the Borough Secretary advertise for bids, for this proposed project, was upon a vote so ordered. The request of Frank Twist for consideration, of a storm sewer drainage from a point on his property South about 216 feet to an outlet, was after some discussion ordered tabled untill August 1966 Meeting. The Planning Commission requested Council to appoint some one in the place of John W. Long, who died recently, several names were presented as follows; Mark Y. Bolig, Harold Singer Robbin Swank and John Neil, the Borough planning committee, was asked to contact the above, and report at the next meeting of Council. J. F. Snyder requested council to advise him relative to the collecting of the delinquent tax of the Borough, stated that a conflict, in the present set up, was causing considerable confusion, upon a motion of Skelly seconded by Lewis, upon the advice of the Solicitor, that Mr. Snyder should continue to collect the Borough delinquent tax. The property committee that called attention to the necessity of purchasing a street sweeper, Michaels stated that in his opinion, a large machine, such as had been demonstrated, was not the type that could be used for other than street sweeping, suggested that a smaller sweeper such



as the one, which had been demonstrated, some time ago, was more versatile and could be used in several other Borough operations, such as loading and leveling off, as well as street sweeping; A motion of Skelley seconded by Brown, was then had, to advertise for bids, Mr. Michael having the specifications, for the particular type of machine, upon a vote motion carried. Borough secretary was instructed to contact several citizens, relative to weeds and old trees, which are to be removed.

Joseph Peyser was present and presented council with the Annual Report of the activities of the Sewer Authority, for the year of 1965.

The bills were read for the Sewer account as follows; North'd Water Co \$ 42.54, McCorkill Ins. Agency 150.00, Andrew's Hdwe Co 27.40, P.P.&.L.Co 72.62, McKesson & Robbins Inc 45.00, Penn Gas & Water Co 6.19, Brosious Lumber Co 4.59, Borough General Account 399183. Total \$ 748.17. Ordered paid upon a motion of Waltz seconded by Lewis motion carried.

The Borough bills were then read, and upon a motion of Brown seconded by Sanders upon a vote motion carried.
