

of the Sunbury Island Park bridge was read, and upon a motion of Waltz and seconded by Hollenbach, so ordered.


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Bids for the run coverage job, were again discussed, and upon a motion of Skelly Seconded by Waltz, it was brought upon the table for action. A Motion of Hollenbach seconded by Sanders to the effect that the property owner be assessed at the rate of \$5.00 per foot, on both sides of the run be made, in as much as the Catholic Church owns both sides of the property it will be assessed at the rate of \$10.00 per foot. upon a vote it was so ordered. Penn Selin Construction Company was awarded the contract at their bid of \$ 3365.00, complete job, not to include top soil and seeding. Penn-Selin Construction Co. to wait until an easement from the property owner, was recieved by our solicitor before commencing work. A discussion was then had, concerning the run which is open from Wheatly avenue to Queen street, which had been the cause of severe criticism. At a recent heavy rain, Micheals stated that his men had hauled a truck load and a half, of debris, from the stream bed, after the high rain, had subsided, he stated that the cause of the blockage was an iron fence and a gate which had been placed over the outlet of the stream, at the Queen street end, by James Groninger, whose property adjoins the stream at that point, otherwise the water would have run off with little or no trouble. Mr. Groninger who was present; was advised to remove the obstruction by the Solicitor. William Hollenbach, then stated that he had been contacted by Russell Haddon, regarding a water condition, in front of his home on Water street, The Mayor was present and he stated that he had been out in front of the residence in question, when the water was still very high, several solutions were offered, such as a change in grade and a new pipe line over the Haddon property, no action was taken. Waltz then stated that he had been requested by the Number 1 Fire Company, to have permission granted them, to have the Electric wiring system changed as recommended by the P.P.&.L.Co; representatives, upon a motion of Skelly seconded by Sanders, upon a vote this permission was granted. Waltz then stated that a man from the Gamewell Fire Alarm Company, had been in town, and inspected the possibility of attaching Two more horns to the present system, in order that firemen living in other parts of the town could hear an alarm, it was the decision of the Gamewell man, that this was not feasible, and he agreed to furnish a plan which would be more satisfactory. Penna Power & Light Co. has made arrangements to re-place a Street Light, from it present location on Lower King street, to Villa-Vista section,

where Harry Forrey, had requested a light be placed. Approved by a motion of Hollenbach, seconded by Waltz, so ordered.

The purpose of the special meeting was to consult with ~~the~~ "the Planning Commission" on the proposed extension of the Borough Sewer System, in the Villa Vista and Troxell Addition section of the Borough.

Present from the Planning Commission, were Sabo, Taute, Ansolome, Singer. Also present were Mayor Fister, Borough Foreman Michaels and Solicitor Steele.

The meeting opened with the reading of all correspondence to date, with the Michael Baker Company.

A general discussion was then had, concerning various phases of the proposed plan, as received from Michael Baker Company; it was after considerable discussion, agreed, to allow the "Planning Commission" time, to evaluate the various alternate plans. and to recommend to Council, their findings. The print was left, in the hands of Sabo, for their continued persuance.

A motion of Aceto, seconded by Brown, to adjourn was then made, upon a vote it was so ordered.

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Northumberland Borough Council, was held this evening; with the following members present: President Zimmerman, Aceto, Hackenberg, Hollenbach, Lewis, Skelley, Sanders and Waltz.

The meeting was opened with a prayer, by Lewis, for guidance and understanding; in coming to any decisions.

Minutes of the last regular and Special meeting of the Council were not read, in order to save time, upon a motion of Sanders seconded by Hollenbach, so ordered.

Communications were received from the following sources, Capital Blue Cross, Washington National Insurance, Department of Highways; Institute of Municipal Government, Z.H. Confair Senator, Mrs. Jennie Dieffenderfer, and the Northumberland Planning Commission,

The following reports were then read, and upon a motion of Waltz seconded by Sanders ordered accepted and filed, as follows; Board of Health, Complaints received and abated 4, X-Ray Cards 1, Inspections 4, License issued 1, Fee collected \$1.00, The Police reported for the month of August 87 calls answered, 9 accidents investigated, 3 hit and run, 6 motor code arrests, Meter Fines \$79.00. Motor Code 15,00 total \$94.00, J.F. Snyder reported the collection of 8021.48, The Borough treasurer reported for the Sewer Account as follows; Deposits 105.00. For the Borough General Account the following F. Michael phone, 1.00, Tom Walker License 1.66, Donald Treon 8802.55, R.S. Whitmer Fines 140.00, Harold Hessler 377.00, J.F. Snyder 8021.48, M.H. Weidner 87.00, No 1. Coal Bill 1965-66- 259.15, Rea & Derrick 5.00, Ralph Rosencrans 5.00, A.L. Raker 38.50, Andrews Hdwe 10.00, William Feaster 88.04, County Treasurer 177.33, Penna Gas Co 5.00, Robert Fisher 5.00, Clementine Clark, 19.60, John Wadeck 5.00, Sewer Revenue Acct 422.78, F. Aceto, then proceeded to explain the letter which had been read, concerning the proposed sewer extension, and the equipment in the park, he stated that it was the Planning Commissions intention, to engage an engineer, to make a study of the proposed project and to report his recommendations to them, in the near future, also; stated that he thought that any further work in the park should wait until a report was received from the relative to the above.

Waltz, stated that he had been contacted by Cummings, who stated that the batteries of the Fire Alarm System were becoming weak, and he recommended the purchase of 10 sets of 3 each, to replace the old ones; upon a motion of Hollenbach seconded by Sander's these batteries were to be ordered, upon a vote it was approved; Waltz asked council to approve a request from the P.P.&.L.Co, for approval, of the moving a pole, at the Rea & Derrick Plant, this was authorized by council. A request by Russel Haddon, for the elimination, of a serious water problem, caused by too small a Storm Water pipe, was discussed, it was finally agreed, that Micheles, be instructed to get more information on the matter, and report at the next meeting of council, relative to the possibility of the costs and so forth. Micheles then proposed a plan for the council to study, relative to the Storm Water problem, of Frank Twist, he suggested that Mr. Twist make the necessary contracts, and then the Borough, would not be obligated, or set a precedent, except that the Borough could reimburse, Mr. Twist proportionately. Charles Lewis produced a letter, from Jennie Diefendifer, relative to damage to property, at a recent storm, this was upon a motion of Hollenbach seconded by Waltz ordered turned over to Edward Pfieffer, for action. The Mayor, read a letter signed by Ed. Smither, who is unknown, by the post office, relative to the laying of a sidewalk at the East side of Fifth Street, between King & Sheetz ave; no action was taken. Micheals then called attention to a condition on Sunny Hill, stated that the new street, had been cut to grade, and this left a high bank, which he was unable to do any thing with, the street committee was instructed to meet with Mr. Micheal and try and find a solution to the problem. Dr Aceto, read a letter, from Robert Ramer, concerning a Sewage problem, Micheals stated that for Mr. Ramer's own protection, he should install an automatic shut off, in his lateral. Lewis read, a letter from Mrs. Metzger, relative to a sewer charge, which she thought was unfair, this was left in the hands of the Sewer committee, for study. Chief Police Weirick, made a request to the council, for the purchasing of Two Short Barrel revolvers, stated that their present equipment was too bulky to be worn under civilian clothes this request was granted and upon a motion of Aceto, seconded by Lewis ordered to purchase at the approximate costs of \$58.00 each, upon a vote so ordered. Micheals then stated that the motor in the pickup truck, was in bad shape, and the property committee was instructed to take this matter under consideration. the cost of a rebuilt motor was \$100.00

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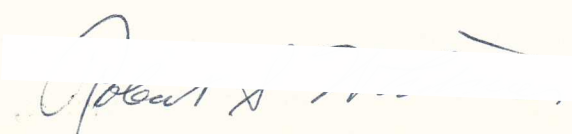
Skelly then brought up the question, of the Borough installing a Gasoline pump, of their own, the estimated saving to the Borough would be considerable, in addition to the fact that gasoline could be had at any time, the present system, did not allow for this, only when the station was open; this was tabled for further discussion. Aceto stated that the "Planning Commission" was studying the Sewer Extension, project, and that it was making plans to engage an Engineer, who, Aceto thought could help them, in their study. Simington Brothers, stated in a letter, that it must advance the cost of their services; from \$6.00 per hour to \$7.00, due to increased costs, this was accepted, and the property committee was advised to look into the matter, for further action.

Dr. Lawrence J. Kopf was elected to serve on the Board of Health, for another term, his present term having expired on the 4th of August 1966.

October 4th, 1966

The regular meeting of the Northumberland Borough Council, was held this evening; with the following members present; President Zimmerman, Brown, Hackenberg, Hollenbach, Lewis, Sanders, Skelly and Waltz absent Aceto.

Meeting opened with a prayer for guidance, prayer made by Hackenberg; a delegation, of women, were present from the La-Iglon Apparel Company, relative to parking on the Borough Streets, during working hours, Chief Police Weirick, stated that in as much as their company has, a parking lot, he thought that the employees should use it; their objection, was that it took too long for them to get to the lot, and get back from lunch, if they used the company lot. Weirick suggested, that he contact the management and see if some thing could be worked out.

Minutes of the last regular meeting were not read, upon a motion of Sanders seconded by Lewis. so ordered; in order to save time.

Correspondence was received from the following sources; John O. Mertz resigning from the office of Auditor, he having moved away from town. Kathleen Catlin, Department of Highways; Northumberland County Development Coordinator. Tyler Pipe & Foundry Co. and The Brosious Lumber Company. who requested Council to abandon East Fifth Street.

Reports from the following were received and read, as follows; Borough Health Officer, Complaints received and abated 3, X-Ray Cards issued 3, Inspections made 4, Licenses issued 1, Fees Collected \$1.00. Chief Police reported the following total Calls 74, accidents investigated 13, Hit & Run 1, Motor Code arrests 8, Meter Fines \$1.50, Motor Code Fines \$10.00, Total \$61.50. the Borough Treasurer reported for the Sewer account as follows; from the Commonwealth of Penna 2% reimbursement 4858.01, H.F. Gourly Tax \$50.00, 567.31 Deposits. Total \$ 5475.32. The Treasurer reported for the Borough General Account as follows; U.S. Treasury 13.80, Bell Telephone Street permit \$15.00, B.F. Weirick Meter Fines 79.00, Tom Walker 1.00, R.S. Whitmer Fines 15.00, North'd Water Co. permits 35.00, Harold Weisler 270.00, M.H. Weidner 112.50, Harold Metzger 5.00, W.&L. Sports 5.00, Penna Gas Co 5.00, County Treasurer 136.61, Sewer Revenue Acct 369.23. Total \$1062.14.

Mr. Frye, was present and asked council, to have the trees trimmed to their recommended height, claimed low limbs struck his truck, after

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a lengthy discussion, it was decided to have the paper, run an article concerning the matter, and then if conditions were not improved, the Borough work~~ment~~ were instructed to take over the job, 1st of December was time set. Fred Troxell was present and requested Council, to try and hasten the planning of the Sewer Project on the hill section of the Borough, Sanders suggested that he thought that a local Civil Engineer could be contacted, who might be able to speed up the matter, Troxell stated that he would be willing to offer his services, to whom would be selected, he mentioned speaking to Mark Sterr, who is a local man,

Solicitor Steele, stated that it was the Planning Commissions duty to make recommendations to the council, and then council should decide what action should be taken. Also: stated that some provision should be made by the council, to set up special funds, for the Sewer Authority money, which will soon be in the Borough's control. Fred Troxell was given the permission to extend the Sewer Line on Priestley avenue; from its present end, to the property of Donald Troxell, a distance of 200ft, the Borough to furnish pipe, and he the work.

Mayor Lister, asked council, to authorize the sum of \$350.00, for the Fabridam, project, instead, of the Airport Authority, as he felt that more good, would come to the Borough than through the Airport. After considerable discussion, during which time Solicitor Steele, gave a talk relative to the possibility of increased revenue; after a motion was made by Brown seconded by Hollenbach, it was on a vote so ordered. A letter was received from the Brosnau Lumber Company requesting that East Fifth Street, be abandoned, from its present terminus, over to the Susquehanna Road, the Street committee, stated that they had investigated this request, and in their opinion, it was in the best interests of the town not to abandon, this unopened street, and to defer action indefinitely any action, on this request, upon a motion of Brown seconded by Skelly it was upon a vote so ordered. The bills for the street paving were discussed, and it was agreed to assess the property owners along Elliot Drive \$0.75cts per foot, in as much as the Brosnau Lumber Company had paid the base and excavation portion, 75¢ plus \$3.00 per foot curbing for a total of \$3.75, per front foot. The Fifth Street paving was assessed at the front foot of \$2.45, and the cost of curbing at 3.00, of a total of \$5.45. the difference being due to the borough being charged for the excavation and base. also Fifth Street, was 32 foot wide, and Elliot Drive was only 24 feet wide. On a motion of Hollenbach seconded by Skelly the above assessment be made, upon a vote it was so ordered.

Chief Police B.E. Weirick, suggested that it would speed up the flow of traffic on King Street, if the lines were changed and a Red Arrow installed on the bottom of the present lights, indicating a right turn on Red, this was not thought feasible, due to the Large Trucks, swinging, in making a turn South, thereby endangering any other vehicle, attempting to make the Right turn. He then proposed the making of Water Street, and Front Street One Side Parking; after some discussion, this matter was left in the hands of the Safety Committee for further study, and to make a report to council. Michaels was authorized to proceed to install storm water drains on Lower Hanover Street, from present end to the river. Michaels also reported that the Storm Water drain had been installed between A. & B. Streets, over the land of Russell Haddon, this was necessary, due to water flooding over the sidewalk, cost was 527.77. The Finance committee, made plans to meet on October 11th, 1966, for the purpose of setting up the budget proposals for 1967.

The bills for the Sewer Account were then read, and upon a motion of Brown seconded by Skelly ordered paid, as follows; Houtz Printing 35.50, W. & S. A regularly scheduled meeting of the Northumberland Borough Council was held this evening; with the following members present President Zimmerman, Brown, Hackenberg, Hollenbach, Lewis, Sanders, Skelly and Waltz absent Acet, who has been ill.

Meeting opened with a prayer for guidance given by Hackenberg.

Ear Strausser was present, and requested the council, to consider the Zoning Ordinance, which at the present time, prohibits the using of Trailers, in the Borough for living purposes; he has purchased land along the North Branch of the Susquehanna River, and has prospects for the sale of land, pending the change, in present Zoning Laws; in as much as the River overflows, this land periodically, council, agreed to give his request further study, and advise him, relative to any change in the present Zoning Law.

Communications were read from the following sources; Middle Creek Paving Company, Priestley Forsythe Memorial Library, The Borough Planning Commission, the Road Builder. The following reports were received and read, upon a motion of Waltz seconded by Sanders ordered accepted and filed, as follows; Police Department reported 106 calls, 10 accidents investigated, 1 hit and run, 17 Motor Code arrests, tampering with parked cars, 19, School patrol 10, meters repaired 9. The Borough Treasurer reported for the Sewer Account as follows; Deposited 676.91. The Treasurer reported for the Borough General account, the following; J.F. President Zimmerman, stated that it was necessary at this time to appoint Two Auditor's for the Borough due to the fact that two elected Auditors had moved from the Borough. Names suggested as being willing to accept the appointment were Seymour J. Wolfe, Freeman R. Ramer and Francis Weigand, an election was held and Wolfe and Ramer were selected.

At this time action was taken by the Borough Council, to terminate the Northumberland Sewer Authority, the necessary papers, were drawn up by the Solicitor, upon a motion of Hollenbach and seconded by Sanders it was upon a vote, so ordered, papers signed by the Mayor D.C. Fister. President of the Council, F.P. Zimmerman and the Secretary of the Council, R.S. Whitmer, and delivered to Mr. Joseph Peyser representing the Sewer Authority. At this point Mr. Peyser presented a Final Audit of the resources of the Sewer Authority, which showed assets of \$ 72,503.96.

Solicitor Steele, then proposed the following formula, for the placing of funds, in Three separate accounts as follows; and recommended that the amounts be placed in each of the following Accounts. Sewer Treatment Pump and Reserve Fund \$55,000.00, \$30,000.00 in coupon bonds, and \$25,000.00, in Series "H" Bonds. A Sewer Extension Fund, to contain \$ 25,000.00, in "H" bonds. A Third fund known as the Sewer Revenue Fund, to be used for deposit of any other monies; It was also recommended that in order to Transfer funds from one fund to another, that the resolution to transfer, must be approved at Two meetings; of Council. Upon a motion of Sanders seconded by Skelly 2 this was upon a vote approved. Upon a motion of Hollenbach seconded by Lewis it was agreed to invest \$10,000.00, in U.S. Treasury Bills for the Sewer Extension Fund credit, upon a vote this was ordered.

Solicitor Steele, then stated that he thought that the Borough could purchase ground from the R.L. Davis Estate, at or near 8th & Orange streets with a frontage of 240 feet on Orange street and a depth of 190 feet, this was left in the hands of the property committee for further investigation, and to make their recommendation, at the next meeting of the council.

A form letter from the Recreation Committee, was read, and it was agreed that Brown, Skelly and Steele, were to attend the meeting which has been scheduled for the 16th of November 1966, 8.P.M. at Shikellamy High School.

A request from the Borough Planning Commission relative to the acceptance of Buchart & Horn as Consulting Firm, for the Planning Commission, was upon a motion of Waltz seconded by Hollenbach, this was upon a vote so ordered.

Michaels stated that as a Safety measure a STOP Sign should be placed at the intersection of Elliot Drive and Fifth street, at the lower intersection. properly moved by Sanders and seconded by Skelly and upon a vote so ordered

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Waltz stated that there is a move underway, to combine all of the communities, in the area, that is the various groups, who, deal with the improving and making requests to various government agencies, for the advancement of local projects, it is their thought that by combining, that greater consideration, would be given, rather than each acting individually.

The bills for the Sewer account were then read, and upon a motion of Waltz seconded by Brown ordered paid, upon a vote; as follows;
